New Delhi, the 3rd largest city and the capital of India is a synthesis of the modern and the antique. Situated along the Gangetic Plain, the city portrays a picture of rich culture, diversity, architecture and history. It is considered as the travel hub of North India. Civic Administration in Delhi

Delhi, the National Capital Territory mainly comprises of 9 districts. Every district has got 3 sub-districts & is headed by a Deputy Commissioner. Delhi also includes 59 census towns, 27 tehsils, 165 villages apart from the following municipal corporations which actually form the metropolitan area of Delhi:

- 1. Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD)
- 2. Delhi Cantonment Board (DCB)
- 3. New Delhi Municipal Committee (NDMC)

Delhi has taken into its purview four satellite cities namely Faridabad, Gurgaon, Ghaziabad and Noida. New Delhi, the capital of India comes within the purview of NDMC. Delhi claims to own the most galactic Metropolitan Police Force present in world.

ACCESSIBILITY

Delhi is very well linked by road, rail and air which make it easily accessible to overseas traveler. Inter-connected roads and highways and 3 Inter State Bus Terminuses at Anand Vihar, Sarai Kale Khan and Kashmere Gate connects the city to all other major cities in India.

Delhi has three main railway stations situated at Old Delhi, New Delhi and Nizamuddin. Apart from some luxurious trains like Fairy Queen, Palace-on-Wheels and Orient Express which can be availed from New Delhi Cantonment railway station, New Delhi is proud to have Rajdhani Express, one of the most prestigious trains connecting New Delhi to all other state capitals in India.

The city has very good air services. Almost every international airline flies to and from its two major airports: Indira Gandhi International Airport and Palam Domestic Airport. The later connects Delhi domestically to all major cities.

HISTORICAL MONUMENTS

The Red Fort

The Red Fort built by the Mughal emperor Shajahan sprawls over 2.2 kilometers by the banks of river Yamuna. The Fort having two entrances Lahore Gate & Delhi Gate includes Mumtaz Mahal, Khas Mahal, Rang Mahal, Diwan-e Khas, the Hammam and and Shah Burj. It entertains the visitors every evening with a Light and Sound Show.

Purana Quila

Purana Quila i.e. the Old Fort is actually the inner citadel of the city named Dinpanah, constructed by Humayun. Purana Quila smells the ancient stories leaking out from its every corner.

Qutub Minar

Qutub Minar, a tribute to architecture attracts people by its steep mass appeal. It's a five-storey building and the highest tower in India which is made of stone.

India Gate

India Gate standing at the end of Rajpath, is the earnest monument constructed in memory of those 90,000 Indian soldiers who sacrificed their life in World War I. Their names are engraved on its walls.

Shish Mahal

Shish Mahal is the central pavilion constructed by Shah Jahan, although presently advancing towards its decay, have still managed to retain it so as to prove the beauty of the place in Shah Jahan's time.

PARKS

Delhi being the city of Emperors consists of many beautiful and well-maintained gardens.

The Mughal Garden

Mughal Gardens, the famous garden located inside the premises of Rashtrapati Bhavan exhibits a virtual paradise with its small flowerbeds, mown lawns and the four waterways. The garden remains open to visitors every year only from the month of February to the month of March.

Shalimar Garden

The Shalimar Garden, situated in the city suburbs, was the-then first-night staging spot for the Mughal people on the way to Lahore and Kashmir.

Lodi Gardens

The Lodi Gardens is famous for its well-maintained flowering trees, ponds, blossoming shrubs, fountains and artificial streams, domed tombs of the Lodi and Sayyid rulers. The tombs exhibit eminent architecture.

National Zoological Park

Delhi's National Zoological Park located near Purana Qila is one of the elegant Zoos in Asia which provides a natural home to more than 2,000 birds and animals from distant places like America, Africa, Asia and Australia.



Buddha Jayanti Park

This park is one of the appropriate picnic spots with a flowery garden. It's also an ideal place for joggers and aged people.

GALLERIES AND MUSEUMS

Natural History Museum

Natural History Museum located in FICCI building at Barkhamba exhibits the most pre historic animals, dinosaurs and gigantic birds apart from owning an esteemed Discovery Room.

National Museum

National Museum near India Gate is one of the most interesting places enriched in ancient history of India & Central Asia which can take one through an enchanting journey of ancient India comprising of art and architecture, potteries, costumes and rare coins.

Indira Memorial Museum

Indira Memorial Museum, built in memory of Indira Gandhi still preserves the blood-stained sari along with the sari which she wore on her marriage as well as the most expensive utensils which were gifted in her marriage. It also allows access to the private chambers, reading room, dinning room so as to depict the daily life of India's first lady Prime Minister.

National Gallery of Modern Art

National Gallery of Modern Art owns a great collection of paintings, art and literature. This gallery also provides opportunity to upcoming as well as renowned artists to display their creative works.

PLACE OF WORSHIP

Bahai Temple (Lotus Temple)

Situated on the Bahapur Hills of South Delhi, this gleaming marble structure is a famous place of worship in Delhi that is visited by millions of people every year. This Lotus Temple is an example of modern architecture and is only 45 minutes from the domestic airport.

Jama Masjid

One of India's largest and revered mosques of India, Jama Masjid is located close to the Red Fort in Delhi. It retains the ancient charm of the Mughal period. It gives you the opportunity to enjoy a 'bird's eye view' of the capital of Delhi.

Birla Mandir

This popular place of worship in Delhi is conveniently situated in Central Delhi and is also called the Lakshmi Narayan Temple. The temple depicts the Orissan style of architecture and is replete with many idols representing different Indian Gods.

Nizam-ud-din Shrine

Located on West of Mathura Road, it is the famous and popular tomb of Nizam-ud-din Auliya, the sufi saint. The beautiful performances by the qawwali singers and the prayers in the evening attract a lot of tourists.

ISKCON Temple

Situated on a hilly place, the ISKCON Temple is a composite of temples. This elegant Lord Krishna temple is among the largest temple compounds in India.

Bala Hanuman Temple

Standing on the South-East of Ranmal Lake, this elegant and beautiful temple is a must visit place of worship in Delhi.

St. James Church

St. James Church, the oldest church of Delhi is located in close proximity to the Kashmere Gate in North Delhi. It is alike the dome at Florence Cathedral in Italy which was the 1st renaissance structure which was set up in the world.
